78. Billy Lane

The Clerk received correspondence from the Planning Inspectorate on 27th February informing the Council that the Billy Lane Local Inquiry will take place in the Robinson Library, Timble on Wednesday 28th August commencing at 10.00am.

The Council are requested to inform the Planning Inspectorate of whether they will be in attendance at the Inquiry and if they will provide evidence – in compliance with paragraph 8.4 of the *Definitive Map and Public Path Orders* guidance.

The timetable for sending statements of case and proofs of evidence is as follows:

24th April 2019 – North Yorkshire County to send their statement of case to the Planning Inspectorate;

5th June 2019 – Everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Inquiry must ensure their statement of case is received by the Planning Inspectorate;

31st July 2019 – North Yorkshire County Council, everyone who has made an objection or representation and anyone who wishes to give evidence at the Inquiry must ensure their proof of evidence is received by the Planning Inspectorate.

79. A59 Kex Gill realignment

Cllr S Lumley explained that preparatory work is continuing on the realignment scheme. There have been issues with regards to the bridleway but it is hoped that appropriate mitigation measures can be put in place. The preferred route alignment has had ground stability checks completed and junction improvements at Blubberhouses have been agreed. It is anticipated that the entire scheme would be completed in 14 months and in place in 2021.

80. Police Matters

There were no Police in attendance. There were no reported crimes during December.

81. County and Borough Matters

Cllr S Lumley outlined that the North Yorkshire County Council budget has been set with an increase of 4.99% (inclusive of 2% for social care). Available financial resources remains the biggest challenge as funding from central Government have reduced, leading to rationalisation in some services.

The winter programme is in operation, with over 6,000 miles of road in North Yorkshire, with 54% coverage by the gritting regime. The Vehicle Activated Speed signs should become available for purchase from 1st April – Parishes will be responsible for purchase – the costs could be shared between Parishes.

Cllr V Oldham identified that Harrogate Borough Council has set the budget for the coming year. The Garden Waste Scheme for the Borough is in operation. The Local Lotto is still open and there is a working party being set up with regards to Electric Charging Points across the Borough – if any Councillors would like to make suggestions on locations for these in the Parish please contact Cllr Oldham.
